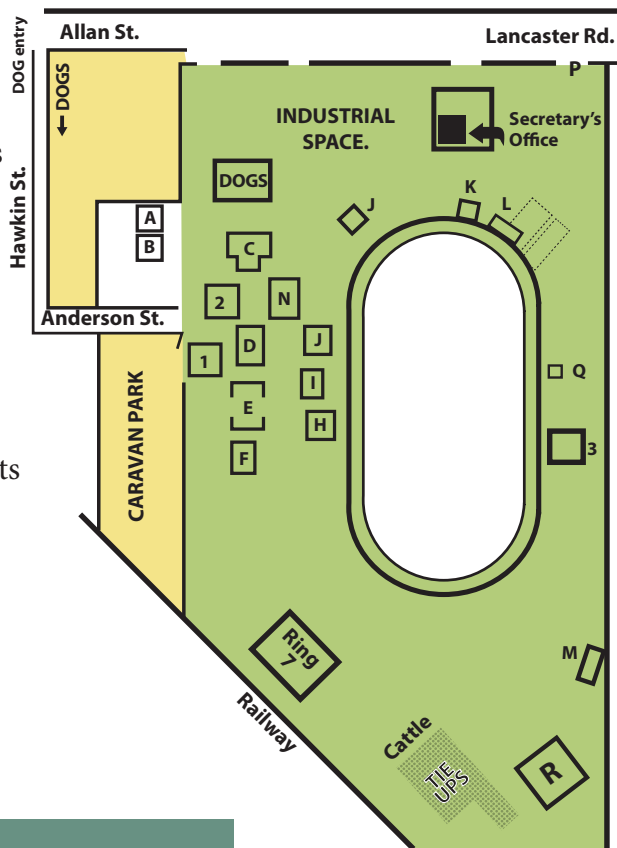

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All entries must be made in writing on the forms to be obtained from the Secretary, and signed by the exhibitor or his agent and lodged with the Secretary on or before Tuesday, 16th October 2018 (except where stated otherwise).

All entries in the horse section are POST ENTRIES.

2. Entry Fees must accompany entries. The council reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving reason for so doing.
3. An Entry Ticket must accompany each exhibit, and no exhibit can be received without it.
4. All exhibits must on the day of entry be the absolute bona fide property of the exhibitor, and all Farm or Horticultural Produce must be the product of the exhibitor, except where stipulated to the contrary. Fancy work and art sections must be the work of the exhibitor. The council may call upon any exhibitor to make a statutory declaration to verify the statement made thereto.
5. No exhibit shall be allowed to compete in any other class in the same section after winning first prize, except where specially provided for. The same exhibit may, however, compete in any other section where eligible, under similar conditions.
6. The judge's decision shall be final.
7. An exhibit shall not be permitted to appear with any distinguishing badge or mark prior to the prize being awarded.
8. The council reserves the right of adjudicating on any questionable entry, or any protest, or on any point not provided in these rules, and its decision in all questions shall be FINAL without recourse.
9. All exhibits must be in their places on the grounds by the time stated on the schedule, and all exhibits must be staged by **11:30am. On Friday 19th October**, and Juvenile exhibits which must be at the Secretary's Office by **4.00pm. Thursday 11th October 2018**
10. The Judge or Judges shall have power to say if any exhibit is not worthy of first prize, and where there is only one entry the judge may award a first prize if the exhibit is of sufficient merit.
11. Any protest against an exhibit or the judge's decision must be made in writing, and lodged with the Secretary of the Society within three hours of Judging. The sum of fifty dollars must accompany the protest, and this shall be forfeited and become the property of the Society, if, in the opinion of the protest committee the protest is frivolous.
12. Any person commenting audibly in a disparaging manner on the judges' decisions, or is guilty of any unseemly conduct or insulting behaviour will, after being cautioned by a member of the council, steward or secretary, be expelled from the showground's, and the said person may forfeit any prize money or trophies gained. All societies affiliated with the G.V.A. Societies Association shall be advised of this, and under the Rules shall have power to take action.
13. (a) The society shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibit, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall not hold the Society responsible and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident.
(b) The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or misdelivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's exhibition, or any loss or damage thereto.
(c) The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss by fire, storm, and damage by water, flood or lightning. Exhibits and displays of all kinds accepted only on this condition.
14. All machinery in motion shall either be securely fenced or be in such position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.
15. No judge shall be an exhibitor in the section or sections in which he (or she) is acting.
16. When the entries are received, these will be posted in the register with all despatch and the entry tickets posted to the address given; but where there is a doubt that through limited postage facilities they may not reach the entrant, these will be retained and handed out at the secretary's offices on morning of Show. This arrangement has been made on account of the annoyance arising from the fact that tickets have not been received necessitating the issue of duplicates.

17. When the judging is completed, and the books checked, any successful exhibitor may collect the cheque, but the council reserves the right to deduct anything owing by exhibitor.
18. Should any exhibitor gaining a prize be disqualified, the next one on the list does not necessarily obtain the prize; the council of the Society shall decide the question.
19. In awarding the Championship, unless otherwise stated, the first prize winner of the relative sex in each class of the relative subsection shall be eligible to compete.
20. In awarding the Reserve Championship, unless otherwise stated, the first prize winner of the relative sex in each class of the relative sub section, other than the exhibit to which the Championship has been awarded shall be eligible to compete together with the second prize winner in the class in which the Champion was awarded first prize.
21. If a Champion shall be disqualified or shall be found to be unqualified to compete in the class for which it was entered, or to compete for the Championship as the case may be, then the Championship shall be awarded to the animal which was awarded the Reserve Championship as the case may be.
22. Only ribbons or cords gained day of show allowed to be displayed.
23. The signing of the certificates of entry of any animal shall be taken as is known to the owner, but if disease is detected, the animal must be removed by the owner, when requested by some responsible person or member of council, and if the disease has been spread, the exhibitor shall be held responsible.
24. No exhibit must be taken from the showgrounds before 4pm. Show day.
25. In all cases where a third prize is awarded the Society's certificate will be given to the successful exhibitor.
26. The privileges of distributing trade circulars, advertisements, announcements or documents are restricted exclusively to exhibitors at their respective stands. No collectors or agents appealing for funds will be permitted to do so, without the permission of the council. Any infringement of this regulation will incur expulsion from the grounds.
27. Any prize money not collected on Show day will remain the property of the Kyabram A.H. & P. Society Inc. and will not be forwarded on.
28. EXTENSION OF LIABILITY OF ANIMALS. The liability of animal's policy is extended to all owners or people responsible for animals wishing to participate in Show events. The policy gives cover from the time these animals enter the Showgrounds until they leave but does not include transit cover. The cover applies to horses, beef and dairy cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, dogs (excluding Shows sanctioned by the K.C.C.) and cats. An amount of 37 ¢ per entry has been added to all livestock classes to cover this insurance.
29. The use of tranquillisers, stimulants, or any drug capable of affecting the performance or behaviour of animals is forbidden.
30. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under veterinary supervision.

CLASS: - 1 (A) RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

VAS LTD rule. Cake **MUST** be baked in a square 20 cm tin with sharp square edges

Ingredients:

250g Sultanas	1/3 Cup of Sherry or Brandy	250g Butter
250g Chopped Raisins	250g Plain Flour	250g Soft Brown Sugar
250g Currants	60g Self Raising Flour	½ Teaspoon Lemon Essence
125g Chopped Mixed Peel	¼ Teaspoon Grated Nutmeg	OR Finely grated lemon Rind
90g Chopped Red Glace Cherries	½ Teaspoon Ground Ginger	½ Teaspoon Almond Essence
90g Chopped Blanched Almonds	1/8 Teaspoon Ground Cloves	½ Teaspoon Vanilla Essence
		4 Large Eggs

Here's what to do: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least one hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20 cm and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces; cherries into 4 to 6 pieces; and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Ingredients:

375 gm Sunbeam Mixed Fruit	2 eggs lightly beaten	¾ cup brown sugar
2 tablespoons marmalade	1 teaspoon mixed spice	1 cup self raising flour
½ cup water	1 cup plain flour	125 gm butter
¼ teaspoon salt	½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda	½ cup sherry

Method

1. Place the Sunbeam Mixed Fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add Bi Carb soda and allow to cool,
3. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.
4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20 cm round cake tin.
5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours, or until cooked when tested.

CLASS: - 1 (C) VAS LTD CARROT CAKE RECIPE

This recipe must be used for this competition

Ingredients:

375 g Plain Flour	375 ml vegetable oil	2 tsp ground cinnamon
1 ½ tsp bicarb soda	3 medium carrots, grated (350 grams)	½ tsp allspice
½ tsp ground nutmeg	180 g pecan nuts crushed	345 g castor sugar
2 tsp salt	2 tsp Baking Powder	4 eggs
220 g tin crushed pineapple, drained		

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 20cm (8") round cake tin and line with baking paper.
2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans.
3. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake in.
4. Bake for approximately 90 - 100 minutes.
5. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow

(35mm high x 90mm wide x 50mm base)**

INGREDIENTS:

2 ½ cups Self-Raising flour	1/3 cup pitted dates	2 eggs, lightly beaten
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon	1 cup coarsely grated carrot	¾ cup orange juice
¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg	1 tablespoon orange marmalade	Cup reduced fat milk
Cup brown sugar (firmly packed)	1 cup canola oil	Icing sugar for dusting

Method

1. Heat oven to 190 C (moderately hot)
2. Line and spray a 12 hole muffin pan with large paper cases
3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates, carrots.
4. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk.
5. Mix until just combined
6. Spoon mixture evenly into prepared pan holes
7. Cook for 20 minutes, (to test muffins are cooked inserted cake skewer.
8. If it comes out clean the muffins are ready
9. Leave muffins in pan for 5 minutes then turn out onto a wire to cool.
10. Display 4 muffins on a plate.

2. Exhibitors must provide own bowls, containers etc, for floral Art; Jars may be used as substitutes for vases.
3. A Vase is a vessel the height of which is greater than its width and the diameter of which must not exceed 3 ½ inches, 1 ½ inches from the top.
4. A Bowl is a round vessel, the diameter of which is greater than it's inside depth.
5. All exhibits in Cut Flower sections to be judged, first for quality of blooms, and must be grown in the open unless otherwise stated.
6. Wiring of flowers is prohibited except where stated, or in the Floral Art Sections.
7. Classification of Flowers is as laid down by the Royal Horticultural Society of Victoria.
8. Every Exhibitor shall, on the day of the Show, apply to the Secretary for his or her exhibitors cards and shall place the appropriate card alongside each exhibit before judging commences.
9. Two or more exhibitors may not exhibit separately from the same garden for prizes in the same schedule number except in Floral Art Sections.

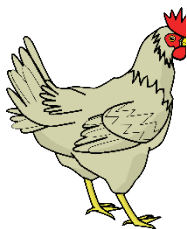

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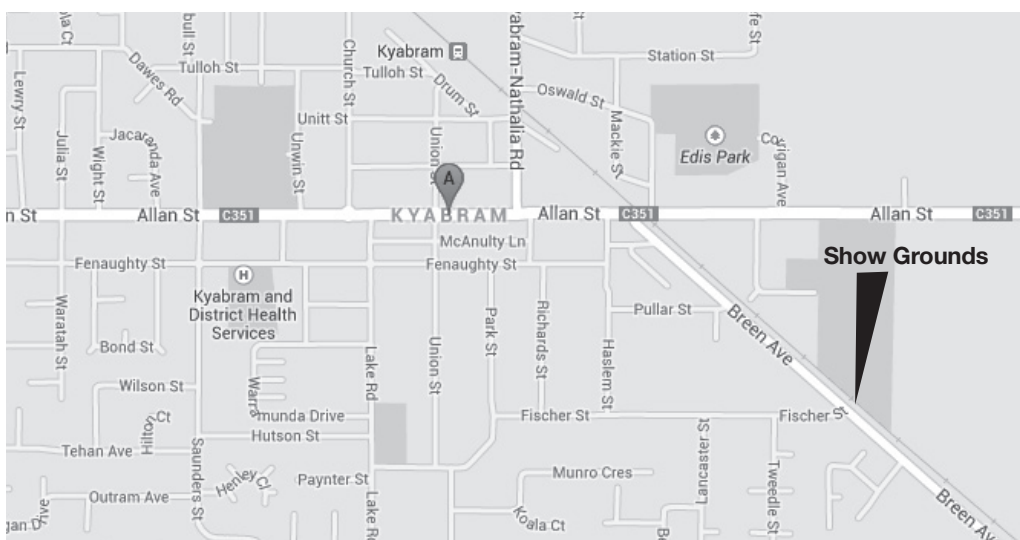
