- 5. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor
- Professional Photographers are not eligible to enter. (Someone that derives the greater percentage of their income as a photographer)
- An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State final
- An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group level and one Group at State level
- An exhibit having won at State final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition
- If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete
- 11. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money
- All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show
- An exhibit may only win one Group final in a show season

KOROIT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY RULES AND REGULATIONS

ENTRIES:

- All entries received shall be subject to the Rules of the Society and Conditions of the Prize Schedule.
- ENTRY FEES, at rates specified in the Schedule, are payable upon entry and entries may be refused if fees are not so prepaid. If entries are accepted without payment of entry fees, the fees must be paid on demand and default will render exhibitors liable to exclusion from future exhibitions of the Society. Defaulters will be reported to the South Western Group of V.A.S.A. and will then be liable to exclusion from exhibitions of all associated societies.
- Entries for all sections must be lodged with the Secretary by 6pm on the dates specified in this schedule.
- Section number, class number and particulars of each entry must be specified by the exhibitor on the entry form provided, and no responsibility will be accepted by the Society if such details are not sufficiently specified, or for any entry not received in.
- No entry will be received in the Stallion Classes unless satisfactory evidence is tendered that a current Life Government Certificate of Soundness and Approval is held by the owner.

AWARDS:

- 6. A first, second or third prize may be awarded for any class if four or more entries. The Judge may withhold a prize altogether where the exhibit is not of sufficient merit. Any exhibit not classified which may be brought forward may receive a prize of certificate or merit, if considered meritorious. In all cases the decision of the judges will be final as regard the merit of the exhibit.
- All prize winning horses and cattle must be taken <_mt on parad.
 Exhibitors failing to comply with this rule shall be liable to forfeit prize money. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

- All prize money must be collected on show day. NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID OUT until after the Grand Parade or at the discretion of the Chief Steward of the section concerned.
- All prize money under \$2 not claimed within 30 days of the show will be forfeited. All other prize money must be claimed within 30 days.
- 10. All protest against awards based on non-compliance with e Conditions of the prize list will be considered by the Committee, if lodged with the Secretary within Three Days after the Show, together with a deposit of25 er cent of the prize money, which, if the protests be deemed frivolous, shall be forfeited. The decision of the Committee shall b final in all classes.
- 11. The Committee reserves the right to reject any time any exhibit submitted for this show without giving reason for so doing.

EXHIBITS:

- The Committee reserves the right to reject at any time any exhibit submitted for show, without giving reason for so doing.
- 13. The owner or exhibitor of any exhibit or stand or exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Committee of this Society must immediately upon notice to that effect remove such exh1b1t or stand or exhibits from the Society's grounds.
- 14. Exhibitors will not be allowed to display Ribbons or Sashes not won at this year's Koroit Show
- Every exhibitor of stock must be in a position to prove the age of his stock if called upon.
- 16. Exhibitors shall, if required, make a statutory declaration to the effect that the exhibit is his or her bona-fide property, and that her or she has adhered to the rules laid down by the Society.
- 17. In classes for Brood Mare or Dairy Cow, the animal must be in milk or visible in foal or calf
- Stallions will not be allowed to compete in any class against mares or geldings. (except in Jumping classes)
- 19. All horse stock to be ridden or led

- on the ground and to be subject to the control of the Committee appointed for the purpose. Any exhibitor infringing this rule will be debarred from exhibiting again. Stud horses must be led into the ring in pl bridleonlt
- 20. Owners entering the JT horses or porues do so entirely at thetr own risk and it is a condition of entry that no liability on any kind attaches itself to the Society, it's council, officers, officials or members in any respect whatsoever other than the liability for refund of entry fees in the event of abandonment of any competitions
- 21. The Pedigree of Bloodstock must be supplied if required.
- 22. Southdown, Suffolk, Ryeland and Polled Dorset Sheep must have been shorn after August I, the year of the show. All other sheep unfairly shorn shall be excluded from exhibitions on day of show.
- 23. All Dairy Stock and Bulls must be led.
 All cattle must be secured by halter.
 Poll exhibits and wholly or partially
 dehorned exhibits shall be securely
 tied up by both, an effective control
 of an attendant. All bulls over one
 year old must be secured by the nose
 when being led, and all bulls of one
 year and over must be rung. In the
 Beef Section, all females must be
 fitted with a nose grip when being led
- 24. All cattle exhibited must be T.B. and Brucellosis free. The Stewards may order the instant removal of any cattle not so tested, and the exhibitor will be liable to any of the following penalties: Forfeiture of prizes, prohibition to exhibit again and expulsion from the Society.

GENERAL:

- 25. The Stewards may have removed from the grounds any person proving to their satisfaction to have been guilty of insulting behaviour to judges, section stewards r other improper conduct or riotous conduct on the Showgrounds and the Committee may also disqualify any such offender from exhibiting at the Society's shows for a tenn determined by the Stewards
- 26. Should the Society disqualify any exhibitor for any reason the Society

- may notify the South Western Group of V.A.S.A. and have the disqualification endorsed by all affiliated Societies
- 27. The exhibitor shall have the right to appeal against disqualification, if such appeal be lodged with the Secretary within three days of the Show.
- 28. All machinery in motion must be securely fenced or be in such position, or of such construction, as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if securely fenced.
- 29. Membership entitles the person whose name is inscribed on the member s' ticket to free admission to the ground with a lady and car, also to a reduction of entry fee as subscribed in the Prize Schedule
- Any disputes to the interpretation of Rules, By-Laws, Regulations or Provisions shall be determined by the Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 31. Whilst reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, no responsibility will be incurred by the Society for any loss of or damage to same, and it shall be a condition of entry of exhibits and of admission of persons to the Showgrounds that under no circumstances can the Society be held in any way responsible for any damage or accident to any person or exhibit or property of any kind that may occur in the Showgrounds or who competes in any event does so at his or her sole risk.
- 32. Entries in pavilion must not be removed until after 4 pm
- 33. All exhibits will be judged on Show Day

Only judges and stewards will be permitted in main pavilion while judging is in progress


