GRAND PARADE

All prize winners in all Horse (Saturday & Sunday only) and Stud Cattle Sections are asked parade at 3:00 pm each day. A Parade card will be issued to exhibitors when they enter the arena for the Grand Parade. This should be presented with the prize voucher for collection of prize money.

No prize money for the above sections will be handed out until after the Grand Parade each day.

Prize money not collected over the Show weekend or within 30 days after the Show will be forfeited.

HISTORY

The mother of Victorian Agricultural Societies, the Port Phillip Farmers' Society was founded in 1848, consisting of the parent body (later the National Agricultural Society) and finally the Royal Agricultural Society and three branches – Mornington, Bacchus Marsh and Gisborne.

In 1856, the Mornington Farmers' Society was formed and the Society's first Show was held at Cranbourne in 1857. Two years later Mornington, Bacchus Marsh and Gisborne held Shows and it was during 1859 that the Whittlesea Agricultural Society had its beginnings on a site near the Whittlesea Railway Station. Here the Whittlesea Fair was held on Tuesday, 3rd May. There were 40 members, who subscribed approximately 1 pound each.

Through lack of interest and support from the branches, the Port Phillip Farmers' Society disbanded, the last Show being in 1867, and all the Show's assets were handed over to Trustees for the new National Agricultural Society in 1870. The Mornington Farmers' Society continued to progress. Eventually in 1918, the Society became known as the Berwick and District Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

From this snippet of history it can be seen that the Whittlesea Agricultural Society in its own right has the proud distinction of being one of the oldest functioning Agricultural Societies in Victoria.



HORSE REGULATIONS - TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH GENERAL REGULATIONS

- The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.
- Where height is stipulated, Equestrian Australia or Show Horse Council current height Certificates will be accepted but the committee and judges reserve the right to re-measure any horse or pony at any time. When measuring a horse, galloway or pony an allowance of (3/8) of an inch for shoes may be made at the discretion of the measurer.
- 3. Horses are not permitted to enter the judging ring if fitted with bearing reins.
- 4. Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council and every exhibitor shall be bound to observe these rules. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written lease recognised by the Society at the time of entry.
- 5. The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.
- 6. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.
- 7. All led stallions must have a bit in mouth (3 years and over).
- Any male animal competing in specific stallion/colt classes in the breeding classes not deemed to be completely entire
 by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete. Any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from
 competing in such classes.
- 9. Horse prize winners are asked to take part in the Grand Parade. A Parade card will be issued to exhibitors when they enter the arena for the Grand Parade. This should be presented with prize voucher for collection of prize money. (Friday classes excluded). Horse prize money will be available only from the Horse Pavilion after the Grand Parade and until 6pm or at the discretion of the Horse Chairperson only.
- 10. Children under the age of 6 must be led or accompanied by an adult.
- All competitors under the age of 18 years must supply proof of age with entry. Proof of age will be accepted in the form of birth certificate, extract of birth entry, statutory declaration by either parent, baptismal certificate or Principal's certificate.
- 12. Owners entering their horses or ponies do so entirely at their own risk and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the Society, its officials or members in any respect whatsoever other than the liability for refund of entry fees in the event of abandonment of any competition.
- 13. All foals must be haltered in the ring.
- 14. A novice is a horse not having won a first prize at an Agricultural Show.
- 15. Certificate showing proof of Registration with a particular Breed Society to be produced if requested on the day.
- 16. Random swabbing of horses will take place under Equestrian Australia Anti Doping Regulations as per Equestrian Australia National Medication Control rules and Show Horse Council Rules.
- 17. VAS Ltd rules as of 26/04/2017 refer to VAS Ltd website for full details http://www.vicagshows.com.au.
- 18. VAS Ltd approved helmets must be worn by all competitors. EA approved helmets to be worn by all Jumpers.
- When a class is age restricted, eg Riders, Smartest on Parade and Childs Mounts, top boots or gaiters cannot be worn by competitors under the age of 18 years.
- Waiver form must be signed by all competitors. If under 18 a parent or guardian must sign on their behalf. Any riders not
 signing waiver form will forfeit any qualification and prize money.
- 21. Any PRIZE MONEY or trophies not collected within 30 days will be forfeited.
- 22. Yards are available on a first-in basis. Cost is \$20 per day. Yards and Memberships are non-refundable.





 - All pure bred stock exhibited may be subject to inspection by an inspector appointed by the Society, who will examine the tattoo brands on all stock exhibited, and if the animal/s are found to be incorrectly branded, they will be disqualified.
- 2. Cow or heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging or vice versa.
- Cows or Heifers entered in the "in milk" classes may be required to be stripped prior to entering the judging ring.
- 4. Judges have the right to order any cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.
- All bulls born prior to November 1st 2017, MUST be fitted with a nose ring and secured by this at all times when being led. The Council reserves the right to order the immediate removal from the ground of any animal deemed to be dangerous.
- Judging will commence at 9.00 am sharp and all stock must parade before the judges when called upon by the Stewards to do so. The Judge's decision shall be final and binding.
- The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age and any breeding animal not being completely entire shall be final.
- 8. All entries must be made in writing on the standard entry forms supplied by the Society. Entries must be in the hands of the Secretary by the prescribed date and accompanied by the appropriate entry fees.
- All stock must be bona fide property of the exhibitor. The Council may call upon any exhibitor to produce evidence to verify the fact.
- 10. All prize-winning animals are asked to take part in the Grand Parade. A Parade Card will be issued to exhibitors when they enter the arena for the Grand Parade. This should be presented with the prize voucher for the collection of Prize money.
- 11. No stock can be removed from the ground before the Grand Parade.



SHEEP REGULATIONS

To be read in conjunction with General Regulations

- In accordance with new Victorian State Laws all sheep breeds born in Victoria from 1 January 2017 must be identified with an ELECTRONIC NLIS (sheep) tag before being consigned to an Agricultural Show or to another property. If you are entering lambs born in 2017 and beyond please ensure they are tagged accordingly.
- 2. A National Sheep Health Statement must be completed by all exhibitors and returned with entry form.
- 3. Sheep may be shown either in wool or shorn, shorn sheep to be shorn after 1st August 2018.
- All sheep and lambs must be registered with the respective breed organisation and tagged with the breeders
 property of origin NLIS tag. Sheep not tagged will be disqualified and must be removed from the showgrounds.
- REGISTRATION DETAILS AND FLOCK NUMBER MUST BE WRITTEN ON ENTRY FORM, or entry will be ineligible.
- All Rams to be Brucellosis tested, or from brucellosis accredited free flocks. Certificates must be produced on request.
- 7. Johne's Disease whilst no responsibility can be taken by the Society for the actions of exhibitors in exhibiting livestock with a "0" ABC map score, the Society will ensure the sheep shed will be cleaned prior to the show and clean straw provided. It will be the responsibility of exhibitors to ensure that the laneways are kept clear of urine soaked material and faeces, and the Society will undertake the responsibility to ensure that judging areas are kept clean and tidy.
- 8. No sheep shall be allowed to compete if infected with footrot or external parasites.
- 9. Owners must parade their sheep for judging, if required.
- 10. The sheep pavilion has a maximum number of 100 entrants. Should this number be exceeded then a maximum number of exhibits per entrant will apply at the discrection of the Superintendent.
- 11. Exhibits will not be accepted later than 8.30 am and cannot leave shed until after 4:30 pm.
- 12. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 13. All sheep must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor and been property of the owner for at least 3 months.
- 14. STRICTLY NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED IN THE PAVILION

250g sultanas 1/3 cup sherry or brandy 250a butter 250g chopped raisins 250g soft brown sugar 250g plain flour 250g currants 60g self-raising flour 4 large eggs 125g chopped mixed peel 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg ½ teasppon almond essence 90g chopped glace cherries ½ teaspoon ground ginger ½ teaspoon vanilla essence 90g chopped blanched almonds ½ teaspoon ground cloves ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

Here's what you do:

- 1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

Steps

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C (160C fan), Grease a 20cm (8") round cake tin and line with baking paper.
- 2. Sift the dry ingredients together into a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat the eggs and oil, then add to the dry ingredients. Mix well then add the carrots, crushed pineapple and pecans. Mix to form a smooth batter and pour into the cake tin.
- 3. Bake for approximately 90-100 minutes.
- 4. Remove from the oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on the wire rack.



GENERAL REGULATIONS OF THE WHITTLESEA AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY INC. TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH GROUP REGULATIONS

- Society Member's Ticket \$50 and Show Weekend Member's Ticket of \$45 admits member, guest and member's children 14 years & Under on both days of Annual Show and vehicle to Member's Car Park.
- Public admission, (inc GST): Adults \$20, children 6-14 \$5.00, Children under 6 FREE, Concession \$15.00, Secondary School Concession (on presentation of School Photo ID Card Only) \$15.00. Family Pass (2 Adults & up to 4 Children aged 6-14 years) \$45.00. Cars in public parks, free.
- 3. Entries: Entry fees for livestock, arena events, with the exception of Feature Events, are subject to a reduction of 1/3 of the price to holders of Member's Tickets.
- 4. At 3.00 pm all prizewinners in Horses and Stud Cattle sections are asked to parade.
- In all sections where there are two or more prizes, there must be three competitors or only one prize will be awarded, unless the judges consider the exhibit worthy of a prize.
- The judges may award a second instead of a first where the animals or articles are not considered of sufficient merit.
- 7. All exhibits to stay in the Showgrounds until 5 pm, excepting livestock.
- 8. Breeding year for horses dates from August 1, for dairy cattle from July 1, and for beef cattle as at the final day of the Show.
- Any animal, in the opinion of the judge, to be over the age specified, will be referred to the Chief Stewards.
- 10. Stallions are not eligible to compete in ridden classes unless specified.
- 11. Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured and ticket endorsed by Official Measurer who will be in attendance from 7.30 am to 8.30am or have a current VASLtd/SHC or EA height certificate.
- 12. Any protests to be lodged with the Secretary (together with \$150 deposit, which amount will be forfeited if complaint is frivolous), within 60 minutes after award, or for Sections judged prior to the Show, within 60 minutes of Show opening time. The Chief Stewards will consider the protest and their decision will be final.
- 13. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list of awards does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Chief Stewards, with or without the advice of the judge, shall decide.
- 14. No exhibitor or spectator will be admitted to any judging area during the judging, unless requested to do so by the Steward in charge of the Section.
- 15. Any person commenting audibly in a disparaging manner on the judges' decisions, or who is guilty of unseemly conduct or insulting behaviour will, after being cautioned by a member of the Chief Stewards or Secretary, be expelled from the Showground, and the said person may forfeit any prize money or trophies gained. All Societies affiliated with the Central & Upper Goulburn Group shall be advised of this and under the Rules shall have power to take action. The judges' decision will be final.
- 16. All exhibitors, competitors or volunteers are expected to display appropriate behaviour and respect in dealing with the WAS Inc. and the Society's representatives during the annual Show and related events. Inappropriate behaviour will be referred to the President and/or Chief Stewards for action.
- 17. Any person refusing to attach the prize card to any exhibit to which the prize is awarded and to keep the same on during the hours of the exhibition, will on proof thereof to the Chief Stewards, be disqualified from receiving all prizes awarded to the said person during the Show.

- 18. Prize money to be paid on the Weekend of the Show. Any prizes not claimed within <u>30 days</u> from date of Show become the property of the Society.
- No claims for refunds of entry money will be paid, with the exception of Livestock on presentation of a vet's certificate.
- 20. The Council will not be responsible for trophies donated as a prize if not collected within thirty days of the Show.
- 21. All trophies not won outright to be returned to Secretary one week before Show Day.
- 22. The Society reserves the right to allot a trophy in place of prize money or vice versa.
- 23. The books of the Society close on the last day of December each year. All accounts for 2018 must be in the hands of the Treasurer prior to this date.
- 24. All entries to be made in writing, addressed to the Secretary. Closing dates for entries vary according to Sectional requirements, refer to information notes throughout the Schedule. No late entries will be taken unless specified.
- 25. Most Pavilions will be closed at 5 pm on the Saturday and at 5pm on the Sunday of the Show. Exhibitors will be admitted without an entry ticket only to take charge of their Exhibits after 5.30pm.
- 26. All exhibits must, on the days of the Show, be the bona fide property of the exhibitor. The Society Council may call upon any exhibitor to make a statutory declaration to verify the fact.
- 27. (a) The Society shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through an exhibit, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor or competitor shall not hold the Society responsible, and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. (b) The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss or misdelivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's exhibition, or any loss or damage thereto. (c) The Society shall not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss by fire, storm, damage by water, flood or lightning. Exhibits and displays of all kinds accepted only on this condition.
- All machinery in motion shall either be securely fenced or be in such position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.
- 29. The right to hold Side Shows, Amusements or Exhibition Stands in the Showgrounds must be arranged and paid for before the owners can gain admission to the grounds; and the owners shall, during the days of the Show, be subject to the orders of the Grounds Manager. The Society reserves the right to stop any Side Show or other performance without giving any reason for such action, and all fees be forfeited to the Society. The authority of the Grounds Manager shall be binding on the Society in this matter.
- 30. Gambling is strictly prohibited on the Showgrounds. Any person or persons found practising any illegal game will be given to the Police.
- 31. GST will be added to the prize money for Exhibitors who are registered for GST purposes and have provided an ABN.
- 32. Any Prize money of \$500 or more may be paid by Society Cheque.
- 33. The Society reserves the right to use images taken at the Show in their media and promotional material. If you do not wish your image to be taken, please notify photographer.
- 34. All exhibitors (including trade, livestock & attractions) must supply a current copy of their Insurance Certificate of Currency when entering or confirming attendance. If not supplied, any claim on the Society's Insurance incurs a \$1,500.00 excess.
