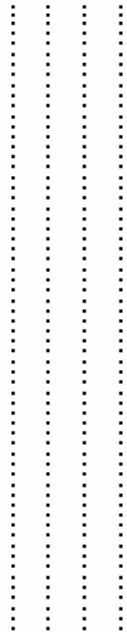

**REGULATIONS**

1. Ground entries must be with Secretary no later than stipulated. Late entries on the day will incur double entry fee unless otherwise stated. No phone/fax entries accepted. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by correct entry fee.
2. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor and all Produce must be grown by the exhibitor during the last 12 months, and in Sections A to H, must have been in the possession of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
3. **All exhibits in Hall must be staged indicated.**
4. No Award Ribbons may be shown on animals other than those won on the day of the show.
5. Each exhibitor must place exhibits where directed by the Stewards, and every exhibit must have the entry card as supplied by the Secretary, attached in a prominent position.
6. Exhibitors must in all cases provide themselves with plates, baskets and stands, and entry must be correctly named.
7. **It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judges.**
8. Where two equal first prizes are awarded, the First prize shall be equally divided.
9. The decision of the Judge as to merits of exhibits shall be final, and without appeal. The stewards or judges jointly or separately shall have the power to disqualify an exhibit, when such exhibit is ineligible for the class shown in.
10. Protests against awards based upon non-compliance with the conditions of the prize list or regulations, must be **lodged with the Secretary before 4.30 pm on the day of judging**, and such protest shall be dealt with at the next ordinary meeting of the committee. Every **protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100** which. Will be forfeited if the committee thinks the protest frivolous.
11. Any infringement of the regulations will disqualify the exhibitor from taking a prize. If dishonest practices are proved, the offender shall be disqualified for all sections the exhibitor may have gained prizes in.
12. The committee shall have power to call for a statutory declaration from any exhibitor that all or any of these regulations have been complied with.
13. Every care will be taken of the exhibits, but the committee will not hold themselves responsible for any damage or loss whatsoever.
14. **Persons in charge of stock must be in readiness with exhibits when called upon.**
15. In awarding special prizes for most successful exhibitor in the various classes where such prizes are specified, a first prize shall be awarded three points, a second prize two points, and a third prize one point.
16. No Exhibit shall be removed from the hall before 3.30pm. And not later than 4.30pm.
17. Novice is one who has never won a first prize.
18. The society does not hold itself responsible for any errors in printing that may occur in the catalogue entries are accepted on these conditions
19. The committee reserves the right to substitute all prizes as deemed necessary or trophies for prize money in any section.

**RICH FOOD CAKE RECIPE**— Here's what you need

Metric Cup measure	
250g sultanas	250g butter
250g chopped seeded raisins	250g soft brown sugar
250g currants	1/2 teaspoon lemon essence <b>OR</b>
125g chopped mixed peel	finely grated lemon rind
90g chopped red glace cherries	1/2 teaspoon almond essence
90g chopped blanched almonds	1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	4 eggs
250g plain flour	60g self raising flour
1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
1/4 teaspoon ground ginger	

**HERE'S WHAT YOU DO**

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared 8" (19cm) tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ —4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces

**19. THE JUNIOR BOILED FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION**

**Local show- \$5.00, Group Level- \$10.00 and State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show- \$55, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$30 and 3<sup>rd</sup> \$15.**

Junior Boiled Fruitcake Competition is open to those under 18 years of age on the day of the local show. This competition is covered by Sunbeams sponsorship. An exhibitor, having won at a country Show will bake another cake for entry in the Group Final, the winner then baking a further cake for the State final at the 2009 Royal Melbourne Show.

**REGULATIONS:** An Exhibitor having won at Show Level is not edible to enter any other shows until after group judging, when if not the winning entry, can compete further. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final. An exhibitor having won at Group Level cannot compete further until after the Royal Melbourne Show. Each cake entered must be the Bona Fida work of the exhibitor. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level than the second place getter is edible to compete.

**BOILED FRUIT CAKE RECIPE:** *The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.*

**Here's what you need:**

- 375g sunbeam Mixed Fruit
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice
- ½ cup of water
- 125g butter
- ½ teaspoon bicarbonate soda
- ½ cup sherry
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons marmalade
- 1 cup self-raising
- 1 cup plain flour
- ¼ teaspoon salt

**Here's what you do:**

1. Place the sunbeam mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove and allow to cool.
3. Add the Bi carb, sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.
4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin
5. Bake in Moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.
