## REGULATIONS

***Intending exhibitors are particularly requested to read these regulations as they will be strictly enforced.***

1. Entries in writing, which must be on the Society's printed form, must be lodged with the Secretary before 4pm Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2012.
2. Any Official acting on behalf of the A. & P. Society will have the power to accept late entries under special conditions.
3. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitors at the time of entry, except where otherwise stated. Exhibitors of stock will furnish full particulars as to Age, Pedigree and Breeder's Name (where name is known) and such other information as the Committee may demand. Proven wilful misrepresentation of Exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize, but will render the Exhibitor liable to be disqualified from exhibiting at future shows of the Society. The onus of proof of the bona fides of Exhibitors will rest upon the Exhibitor.
4. The subscription fee for Members shall be \$16.00 which will admit one Member and one Guest or one Member and his/her immediate family (wife/husband and children up to 12 years). Subscription fee for Single Members shall be \$10.00 and will admit one person only.
5. Entry Fees \$1.00 per entry for the first 10 entries. All entries thereafter free. Children's entries free. Horse and cattle entry fees as stated in the appropriate sections.
6. All Exhibits must be on the ground by 9.30 am on the day of the Show. Pavilion Exhibits will also be received on the afternoon of the day preceding the Show up to 3.00 pm.
7. The Judge's awards must be copied correctly into a register for that purpose. The Committee having the power to make such alterations or additions to them as they may see expedient. No Exhibitor shall have any claim to any prize until the same is finally awarded by the Committee, and no exhibitor shall under any circumstances have the right of action of law suit for any prize.
8. Should there be any reasonable suspect that an exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, then the Committee reserves the right of ordering its removal from, and/or refusing admission to the Show ground.
9. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through, or by any exhibit, and it shall be a condition of Entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless, arising from any accident, loss or damage or non delivery of any Exhibit.
10. The Judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any section where the exhibits are unworthy.
11. Protests with \$50.00 deposit, which may be forfeited if the protest deemed frivolous, must be lodged with the Secretary before 4.30pm on the day of the Show, to be dealt with by the Committee.
12. Exhibits shall not be removed before 4.00pm on the day of the Show, except as the Committee may direct.
13. The Committee will give every possible facility to Exhibitors and every care shall be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
14. No tents, booths or hawkers will be allowed on the ground without permission of the Secretary, and no person shall make any collection on the show Ground for any object, except with the written consent of the President.

15. The Committee reserves the right to alter or omit any item from the programme, and also to postpone or alter the dates of, or to cancel the Show, should same become necessary, and the Committee incurs no responsibility or liability by reason of such action.
16. All yearling prize winners to be led in Grand Parade.
17. All cheques to be presented before 31st March 2012.
18. Pavilion prize money shall be available at the Secretary's Office on Show Day. It may be collected from 4.00pm onwards.
19. The Society shall be under no obligation to forward any prize money not collected on Show Day.
20. Prize money not claimed within 7 days of Show will be forfeited.
21. A Public Liability Insurance fee of \$12.00 is payable by all occupiers of trade space who do not have their own insurance cover. Entry fee in animal classes includes the insurance levy.
22. ALL MEMBERS TICKETS MUST BE PAID FOR BEFORE THE DAY OF THE SHOW.

# HORSES

## REGULATIONS

1. Competitors taking part in any Show Competition do so at their own risk.
2. The Society cannot accept responsibility if the judging happens to conflict with one or more classes of events. Judging will be in the order as appears in the Schedule.
3. Competitors will not be permitted to compete unless entry ticket is produced.
4. No entry allowed to enter inner ring after commencement of Judging.
5. Random swabbing may take place.
6. The Official Measuring Steward will be available on request.
7. Breeding year dates from 1<sup>st</sup> August.
8. A competitor receiving a championship in any one ring is ineligible from competing in any other ring.
9. Show hunters are ponies, galloways and hacks with more substance than the modern riding pony and show hack but still maintaining quality. They are expected to move freely at all paces. Show hunters are at any time expected to gallop for the judge. Show Hunters are not expected to jump.
10. Competitors not parading will forfeit their prize money and championship award and their performance will not be recorded with the E.F.A or R.A.S

Any rider under the age of 18 years, riding a horse at an EFA or affiliated event, must wear protective headgear to the current Australian, European or American Standard. The retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times. Riders without approved head gear shall be ineligible to compete until rectified. This rule applies to all events, not just under age competition.

No prize money paid unless more than one competitor in each event.

**Entry Fee includes Insurance Levy to cover exhibitors for Public Liability Insurance. Exhibitors MUST complete Insurance Form and Privacy Statement before competing**

### *Here's what you need:*

250g sultanas	250g butter
250g chopped raisins	250g soft brown sugar
250g currants	1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR
125g chopped mixed peel	finely grated lemon rind
90g chopped red glazed cherries	1/2 teaspoon almond essence
90g chopped blanched almonds	1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
1/3 cup sherry or brandy	4 large eggs
250g plain flour	
60g self-raising flour	
1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg	
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger	
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves	

### *Here's what you do:*

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least an hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared 20cm square tin (no rounded corners) and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3.5 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

**NOTE:** To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces; cherries 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarb soda and allow to cool.

4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20 cm round cake tin.
5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours, or until cooked when tested.
