Agricultural Shows Australia Handbook

The National Agricultural Shows Australia (ASA) Dairy Cattle Young Paraders Championship (National Championship) is designed to determine the Competitors who present and parade an animal before a Championship judge most effectively.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. To be eligible to compete in the National ASA Dairy Cattle Young Paraders Championship, each Competitor must have lived, worked or attended school within a Nation/ State/ Territory they represent in the previous three (3) months and can only represent one Nation/ State/ Territory at a National Championship in any given Calendar year.
- 2. Competitors must be fifteen (15) and under twenty-five (25) years of age on first (1st) May in the year of the Competitor's Nation/ State/ Territory Final. Competitors under the age of eighteen (18) must be accompanied by a chaperone.
- 3. Each year, one (1) Competitor is to represent each State/ Territory and one (1) Competitor to represent any affiliated National organisation (e.g. New Zealand).
- 4. State/ Territory/ Secretaries <u>must</u> inform the ASA Secretariat of the title, name, address, date of birth, age, contact numbers (phone and mobile) and email address of **their** Competitor in a Judging Championship going on to a National Championship Final. The ASA Secretariat will advise these Competitors of the venue and time of the National Championship Final.
- 5. The winner and runner-up of the National Championship should be requested to do a report on any travel tour they undertake to validate sponsorship money.
- 6. The winner is ineligible to compete again after winning the final of the National ASA Dairy Cattle Young Paraders Championship.
- 7. Competitors will be eliminated from the National Championship if the Judge's Steward considers they are receiving outside assistance including the use of unauthorised devices.

Notes for Host Nation/ State/ Territory

1. Each year nominations can be received from the National Final Host for the Data Reader and Data Entry Steward positions. Appointees will be approved by the National Competitions Working Group (NCWG). Both appointees are required to attend a Training Workshop prior to the National Finals.

Host Nation/ State/ Territory/ is to provide all other Stewards. Any vacant Steward positions will be filled by the NCWG.

- 2. The role and activities of Officials is listed in the 'National ASA Young Judges & Paraders Championship Official Duties Handbook.'
- 3. One (1) Championship judge is required for this National ASA Dairy Cattle Young Paraders Championship.
- 4. The Host Royal Agricultural Society Show is to provide equipment for cleaning, grooming and preparing animals for the National Championship. To ask the owner of the animal to assist in providing the Competitor with grooming products, etc.
- 5. Host Nation/ State/ Territory to select suitable animals at time of ballot.
- 6. Rules and Regulations for the National Championship to be sent out to Competitors through the ASA Secretariat.

The arrangements for the conduct of the National Championship are as follows:

A. PROCEDURE FOR RUNNING THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

- 1. One Class of Competitors is to be judged.
- 2. Each Competitor must be identified with an armband numbered one, two, three, four, five, six, seven (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7), and <u>not</u> A, B, C, D, E, F, G.
- 3. Competitors must lead a Dairy Female under twenty-four (24) months (**DRY**). One (1) animal per Competitor.
- 4. Breeds that can be selected from are not limited to Holstein Friesian, Australian Illawarra Shorthorn, Jersey, Guernsey, Ayrshire or Brown Swiss.
- 5. Animals in this Championship must be identified by 'breastplates' numbered one, two, three, four, five, six, seven (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7), and **not** A, B, C, D, E, F, G.
- 6. Competitors will be required to ballot for their animal one (1) hour prior to the Parading Championship.
- 7. Competitors will have one (1) hour to prepare their animal unassisted for presentation at the Championship Judging.
- 8. Competitors must wear a white shirt and white pants with no names or Logo on the clothing, and otherwise be neatly and suitably attired. Male Competitors must wear a tie. Points will be deducted for poor presentation. Shorts and thongs are not permitted.
- 9. Ribbons to be presented in colour order of Blue First (1st), Red Second (2nd), White Third (3rd), Yellow Forth (4th).
- 10. During the National Championship, the Championship Judge will instruct Competitors to swap animals.

B. PARADING OF ANIMALS

Competitors will parade their animals in a clockwise manner as is normal in a Dairy of Beef Cattle Judging Ring at the discretion of the Championship Judge.

C. <u>CHAMPIONSHIP TIMING</u>

From the point of view of the Competitors, the animals and the spectators, it is important that the whole National Championship be completed in one hour. In order to maintain the impetus of the National Championship, immediately the Championship Judge has completed his/ her placings and made his/ her final comments, the National Championship results should be announced and the Awards and Presentations made.

Note that a copy of the National Championship final results should be retained for the ASA Secretariat.
