## Supporting Agricultural Shows & Field Days

### **Round 2 - Federal Government Cancelled Show Grants**

This grant is to assist with operational costs of shows and field days that were scheduled to occur between 01/01/2021 - 31/12/2021 but were forced to cancel due to COVID-19 restrictions.

The round 2 application process has been streamlined to provide clarity and assist applicants to apply for their grant as quickly and easily as possible.

## Applications Open 28th January 2022

## **Applications Close 17th February 2022**

### Grant Values align with Round one: Small Shows (\$10,000) Medium Shows (\$15,000) Large Shows (\$70,000)

Eligible applicants will receive payment within the 2021-22 Financial Year being by the 30th June 2022.

### Maldon & Baringhup Agricultural Society Inc.

#### Powering our Community to a strong future.

In early 2020 the Maldon & Baringhup Agricultural Society submitted a grant application through the Australian Government's Regional Agricultural Show Development Grants, the grants were designed to provide funding for the maintenance and upgrade of existing infrastructure and the purchasing, building construction of new infrastructure related to the running of an Agricultural Show on regional showgrounds.

The Maldon & Baringhup Agricultural Society main aim when applying for the grant were to

- Improved amenity of showground infrastructure to improve the experience of showground users and visitors.
- Improved flexibility of use of showground infrastructure to increase the opportunity for it to be used for other events that bring the community together.
- Use of modern construction methods and materials that reduce the cost of ongoing maintenance and repair of infrastructure.
- Reduced operational costs for events conducted at and using showground facilities.
- Greater variety of attractions to improve the show's ability to attract visitors.

The plan was to carry out 3 projects all of which will reduce the burden on volunteers during bumpin/out, increasing safety for all users of the venue, providing first class facilities for the wider community and reduce the running cost of the event which will insure the longevity of the Maldon & Baringhup Show and other events held at the recreation Reserve.

1. Install a generator, switchboards, underground cabling for power and public address system. The aim is to increase electrical safety, reduce costs in putting on the show which currently hires all labour and equipment each year.

2. Purchase and installation of Grandstand seating and picnic tables and chairs. The main aim is to provide our patrons with facilities that match major shows and encourage families to spend more time at the show in comfort.

3. Purchase sheep yard penning, this will reduce the volunteer labor in setting up, provide better display of the sheep to the public and reduce safety concerns from farmers around stock getting injured.

The Maldon & Baringhup Agricultural Society applied for and were successful in obtaining funding of \$116154.18 ex GST for the 3 projects. We would like to acknowledge and thank them for their support in our application to The Maldon Racecourse Committee of Management, DELWP, Maldon Campdraft Association and Maldon Pony Club.

### Mansfield A & P Society Inc.

#### Indoor Show Success for Mansfield

The Mansfield A & P Society didn't expect that Victoria would be locked down in various ways for so much time in 2021. The question of whether to proceed with a Mansfield Show loomed large as the year went by. Committee members were given various scenarios for either continuing with a full show, a partial show, or no Mansfield Show. In the end it was felt that to have no show would lead to people becoming disengaged and not being involved in show activities in 2022. It was decided to continue with a reduced show consisting of pavilion competitions in the Ed Harris Pavilion with no spectators allowed. The risks involved in putting on horse events, carnival side-shows and food provision was considered too great.

The Mansfield Pavilion Show took place in good weather on Friday and Saturday 19 and 20 November. The entry numbers were encouraging, with high quality goods presented, particularly in the needlecraft and knitting, cookery and photography sections. The involvement of the CWA members, some acting as stewards, and many as contributors led to a good standard of competition in both adult and children's classes.

The society was most appreciative to have judges prepared to travel to Mansfield. Marge Harris judged the cookery and produce and pickles while Helen Wall did the needlework and craft on the Friday. Noel Minife and Robyn Fairman judged the floriculture and garden produce on the Saturday.

Individuals and businesses in Mansfield supported us with funds and vouchers for prizes and this enabled the amount of money paid to winners to be increased for 2021. It is hoped that this will be possible to continue in 2022. Sashes were also awarded to champion winners.

One of our young committee members Maddie Allan organised for some of the winning artwork, photography, and poetry to be displayed in a local café after the show to give people an opportunity to see some of the excellent entries.

While it was still a lot of hard work involved to set up, the society agrees it was worth doing specially to see how excited some of our competitors were to win prizes.

In 2021-22 the Victorian Government made \$300,000 available to registered Agricultural and Pastoral Societies to support infrastructure development and business activities that celebrate Victoria's agricultural communities, industry and produce. In recognition of the adverse financial impact of COVID-19, the 2021-22 grant funding guidelines continue to allow for up to 90 per cent of the total cost of the project to be funded through the program, with applicants required to fund up to 10 per cent of the total project cost. All or part of the society's contribution may be provided in-kind through donated labour and/or equipment.

Congratulations to all Show Societies & Field Days that were successful and look forward to seeing how the completed projects can make a positive impact on your Show Society.

VAS Ltd appreciates the support of the Victorian State Government to ensure the projects support development or upgrade of facilities, innovative use of technology to encourage remote community participation in agricultural show activities and general calendar events and enhanced public safety of community attendance, including COVID safe measures that align with current Victoria Government community event guidelines.

### **Beef Cattle & Sheep State Finals**

All winners from 2019, 2020, 2021 & 2022 Shows will be still eligible for the State Final to be held at Melbourne Royal (Cattle) & Australian Sheep & Wool Show (Sheep). The winners of the state finals in 2022 will be for the 2023 ASA National Finals



### **Rural Ambassador State Finals**



The VAS Ltd Board has decided to hold over all ambassador winners until 2022 so they can experience being at the Royal Melbourne Show. Any groups that have any further ambassadors will be invited to the State Final for 2022.

### Agricultural Shows Australia National Finals

ASA has confirmed that the 2021 National Championships for Young Judges and Rural Ambassadors will be hosted at the 2022 Sydney Royal Easter Show. This decision now means that both the 2021 and 2022 National Championships will be held at the Sydney Royal Easter Show 8 – 19 April 2022.



## Encouragement to Show Societies to run VAS Competitions

The VAS Ltd Board would like to encourage Show Societies to consider still conducting the VAS Ltd State Competitions as well as any Group Competitions that are conducted at a Group level. This is important so that we have Show Level Winners to compete in Group Finals in 2022 and then compete in State Finals at Royal Melbourne Show in 2022.

Some options to consider that have been suggested by other societies:

- Using a shop front to showcase the entries with drop off & pick up times of entries. Pending restrictions have scheduled viewing times of the exhibits.
- Using a pavilion on your Showgrounds with drop off & pick up times. Use Social Media to publicise the results or if restrictions allow then to open the pavilion to public viewing.
- Online Virtual Competitions

These competitions could take place up until Mid-March or prior to your Group Final.
