### **Chairpersons Report – Jenny Daffy**

Hi All,

Well what a disastrous year 2020 has turned out to be with our State calendar of Shows being cancelled due to Covid-19 restrictions which has been devastating to the Agricultural Show & Field Days world.

I guess many of us were hoping that Covid-19 would only be a short-term problem and not be so impacting as it has been when it started in March. I fully support and respect the Societies for their difficult decisions in cancelling Shows but there was no other option. For the next few months at this stage there is no certainty of getting back to having large public gatherings in the near future either.

For the VAS Board & office staff it has been business as usual in a different way with regular online Board meetings held, supporting Members with response to ongoing issues and lobbying for political support from the State Government which has starting to come together with a planned meeting with the Agricultural Minister in the next couple of weeks.

Unfortunately, the annual Convention weekend was unable to be held but as soon as restrictions allow, a VAS Council meeting will be held incorporating the 2020 VAS Ltd AGM. The annual financial audit has been completed and the Board has approved the audited reports and a full copy of the VAS Ltd Annual report is available on the VAS website in the Members area. Please note: All Society Secretaries will be emailed a copy.

During this time of restrictions some Societies have been innovative running some online competitions, facebook interaction keeping people connected to their Society. There have been suggestions come forward of what Societies can be doing for example: Getting quotes and preparing an application to the State Government Agricultural & Pastoral Society Grants program. Information will be circulated in the coming weeks. Reviewing sponsorship packages, OH&S documentation, and any other Show related items.

Unfortunately, the 2021 January VAS Saddle Horse Championships has been postponed and under review for a future date due to Covid-19 restrictions. This is a very difficult decision to make but with uncertain times its best to provide plenty of notice for all concerned.

Death of Agriculturalists – Unfortunately, the course of nature sees many of our dedicated volunteers pass away from this world. The VAS Board encourages you to notify the office of any Committee Members or former delegates that pass on to be put on record for acknowledgement to a future meeting.

Let's hope that the coming months improve, and we can all have some assurance of getting back to some level of normal life that allows our very important annual events to be conducted again.

#### Victorian Shows Go Online!

VAS Ltd is encouraging all shows to try and run online competitions to ensure you continue to have engagement with your local community and with the absence of the traditional annual show it is an opportunity to keep the interest in your local community. A range of Shows are starting to conduct a series of online competitions and below are some ideas of what your Show might like to run.

#### **ABC Victoria's Virtual Show**

With agricultural shows being cancelled across the board this year, ABC Victoria conducted a virtual show.

On Thursday morning the 10<sup>th</sup> of September between 10 and 11am, they hosted the virtual country show on the radio and all results have now been released with a total of 600 entries across the seven categories.

#### Categories:

- Best Scones (four on a plate, one broken open, one upside down)
- Best Decorated Cupcake
- Best homemade face mask (you can model it if you like!)
- Best Pet (Don't forget to tell us a little about why your pet is so special)
- Best Floral Arrangement
- **Best home grown fruit and/or vegetable** (you can feature one, or if you grow a lot of stuff, show us a plate of your home grown produce)
- Best limerick about Coronavirus (or what you're looking forward to about coming out of lockdown)

#### **Beaufort Show Holds Successful Online Competition**

The Beaufort Show has held an online Lego Competition that has attracted a new record of 60 entries. In the last 15 years at the traditional annual show held, the largest number of Lego entries would have been 25 entries in one year.

The competition sections were re-organised from 3 to 6 separate classes to accommodate the increased number of entries. Each entrant sent in photos of their entry, which was themed around an Agricultural Show. The two photos supplied by the Beaufort Show are Lego display entries of the woodchop and the crowd watching the motorbikes in the stands. "There will be a display in an empty Beaufort shop window of all 60 photos of the entries – definitely worth a look," said James Kirkpatrick, the Show President.

Prizes were awarded to the first 3 placegetters in each section, although place cards and ribbons were awarded to 6th because the standard of entries were so high. The Society is grateful for sponsorship from Goldwind who are building the Stockyard Hill Windfarm. Goldwind generously supplied drink bottles to everyone who entered that did not place in the first three places.

By the time you promote the competition, it closes, judge it and display it – it is about a 4-week task. We will have an October and November competition as well. The Beaufort Show encourages other Show Societies to try and conduct some sort of competition as it maintains visibility within your community. They are also sharing the workload as a different team of volunteers will handle the next competition, which is 4 decorated cup cakes (5 sections in age groups) – 2 photos to be sent in one with the entrant and the cakes – proof of production and one –( or two views ) of just the cakes for the judges.

The Horsham Agricultural Society is running a virtual agricultural show - the first in Victoria! The same week they cancelled their traditional show, they launched their virtual show on May 1st which is open till their official show date of September 27. With no template, the plans to develop a virtual show were made on the run.

Their show now has ten parts to it Virtual Pavilion Exhibits, Virtual Market, Backyard Chook Show, Virtual Animal Nursery, Craft Workshops via Zoom, Facebook Photo Challenge, Facebook Rebus Challenge, Online Showbag Competition, Facebook Concert during Show week and on Show Day and Contactless Fleece Competition (2021).

Their priority has been to keep connected to the community and on Facebook alone they have seen an increase of followers by 15%. However, creating a virtual show, doesn't earn any money.

Nobody will be coming through the gates and sponsors have dropped from 82 sponsors to six and three of them are new!

The Virtual Horsham Show will conclude with a Zoom After Party on October 2 a week after the Show which will see winners announced via Facebook on Show Day.

### **Upcoming Grant Opportunities**

#### 2020-21 Agricultural & Pastoral Society Grants




The Victorian Government is making \$300,000 available for Society Grants again this year. VAS Ltd thanks the State Government for their support again.

Grants up to \$10,000 per society can be applied for to cover the development or upgrade of facilities and amenities at the showgrounds and improvements to business activities and greater community involvement in show activities.

More information will be released in the coming weeks but please start brainstorming/planning with your Show Society, so you have an idea ready to apply when applications open.

#### **Supporting Agricultural Shows Funding**

It will provide one-off payments to agricultural show societies to reimburse their 2020 fixed expenses. All agricultural shows cancelled in 2020 because of COVID-19 are eligible for assistance.



- up to \$10,000 for small shows (attendance was less than 2,000)
- up to \$15,000 for medium shows (attendance was between 2,000 and 4,999)
- up to \$70,000 for large shows (attendance was over 5,000).

You may be reimbursed for: bank fees, utilities, rates, insurance, fire alarms and equipment, cleaning supplies, telecommunications, IT system licencing costs, website costs, state or national show body affiliation fees and rent.

It is anticipated that applications will open in September 2020, with payments commencing soon afterwards. You will be notified by ASA and VAS once applications are open.
